

F-1 Student Employment Options Guide

F-1 students may be authorized for employment in the United States <u>within specific guidelines</u>. Students must **contact a** <u>DSO</u> prior to participating in employment/internships/volunteerism to verify eligibility and the steps to apply. Criteria include maintaining F-1 and the required satisfactory academic standards.

On-Campus Employment	Severe Economic Hardship (Off-Campus Employment)
 Eligibility is effective the first semester at Florida Polytechnic University. Students are responsible for conducting job search; hiring is not guaranteed. Employment must meet regulations for on-campus employment. Copy of employment offer letter must be sent to ISS prior to working. Can work up to 20 hours per week while school is in session, and up to 40 hours per week during school closures (e.g., summer/spring/winter breaks). Not required to be major related and does not count towards CPT or OPT. 	 Must complete one academic year as a F-1 student to be eligible to apply. Students must make a good faith effort to locate employment on campus before applying (verification required). Students must provide <u>evidence of economic hardship</u> based on unforeseen circumstances beyond their control. Students may work up to 20 hours per week. Requires DSO recommendation, USCIS application and fee. Cannot work until approved by USCIS (<u>can take three months or more</u>)
Curricular Practical Training (CPT)	Volunteerism
 Must complete one academic year as a F-1 student to be eligible to apply. Requires DSO, Registrar, and Internship Coordinator approval. Internship is required prior to approval. Must be directly related to the student's field of study. Students must be enrolled in the required internship course to participate. CPT can be part-time or full-time; however, one-year of full-time CPT results in the ineligibility for post-completion OPT (post-OPT). CPT can be approved for up to one academic year; an extension must be requested thereafter. 	 F-1 students may engage in volunteerism if it meets the criterion for performing civically charitable or humanitarian work without promise, expectation or receipt of any form of compensation. Volunteerism cannot be related to a student's field of study. Work that is not charitable/humanitarian or relates to the student's field of study is classified as unpaid work, which requires CPT approval. The <u>F-1 Volunteer Verification Form</u> must be submitted for DSO approval with the required evidence. You may view the US Department of Labor (DOL) <u>volunteer guidelines</u>.
Pre-Completion Optional Practical Training (pre-OPT)	Post-Completion Optional Practical Training (post-OPT)
 Must complete one academic year as a F-1 student to be eligible to apply. Must be directly related to the student's field of study. A job offer is not required to apply but pre-OPT will be counted towards unemployment eligibility and deducted from post-OPT whether employment is secured or not. Requires DSO recommendation, USCIS application and fee. Cannot work until approved by USCIS (can take three months or more) Eligible to work for up to 12 months; students may work 20 hours per week while school is in session and full-time while school is not session. Pre-OPT employment will be deducted from post-OPT eligibility, regardless of full or part-time work. 	 F-1 students are eligible after they complete their program of study. Must be directly related to the program of study. Eligible to apply up to 90 days prior to the I-20 program end date. A job offer is not required to apply; however, students have up to 90 days to secure employment after the start date approved by USCIS. Requires DSO recommendation, USCIS application and fee. Cannot work until approved by USCIS (can take three months or more) Approved for 12 months of part-time or full-time employment. Students are eligible to apply for a 24-month STEM OPT extension up to 90 days prior to their post-OPT I-20 end date.
